The Houses of Scriven Green	Two houses new built in the early 19th century, or perhaps (as so often happened) rebuilt using the foundations of earlier buildings, are Croft and Oak Lea. They are almost identical, but Spinney Croft is the larger and has a true Georgian plan with the staircase going up opposite the front door and a large room on either side. Service accommodation - scullery and pantry - are in a lean-to at the west end, and before this lean-to was added there may have been a detached dairy, because there was a door from the kitchen into the garden which was blocked up when the door into the scullery was made. But the lean-to had appeared by the time the mid-19th century Ordnance Survey map was made.
