The Houses of Scriven Green

Rose Cottage is another central chimney house, dating from the early 18th century and big enough to be a farmhouse or perhaps, as tradition has it, an Inn. It faces onto the Green with the village pound attached to its north. It has, or had when surveyed by the R.C.H.M., a big hooded fireplace with inglenook straight opposite its front door; to the north of the chimney stack was an unheated room, perhaps a buttery, and there was another room originally unheated at the south end of the house. This room was probably a parlour, since beneath it is a big cellar. The present fireplace and chimney this end are 19th century improvements and the upper storey was improved at the same time by raising the eaves and flattening the roof pitch accordingly.

In an attractive situation overlooking the Green, the Cottage is built of mellowed stone under a pantile roof. Also included are Buildings and a medium size Garden with vehicular access, in all 0.200 Acres.

Down Memory Lane Part 2	Scriven village had a bonfire. People collected anything that would burn. Mrs Wardle of Oak View Farm baked masses of food. A piano was wheeled onto the Green courtesy of the Atkinson family of Rose Cottage. The bonfire was lit and the party began with a soldier playing boogie woogie .
Scriven Conservation	Rose Cottage is listed as a building of architectural significance.
Rose Cottage, Scriven Green.	Rose Cottage is early eighteenth century with nineteenth century alterations and twentieth century restoration. This is a central chimney house large enough to be a farmhouse or perhaps, as tradition has it, an inn called "The Three Horseshoes". Built of coursed gritstone rubble, it has a pantile roof with a stone slate eaves course. It is two storied and of tree bays and has quoins and a lobby entrance. The front door stands between bays two and three and is six panelled, the top two glazed, with the remains of a keyed lintel above. Bays one and two have twenty-four pane, three light side sliding sashes. Bay three has a sixteen pane, two light similar sash. The first floor windows are eighteen- pane in bays one and two with twelve-panes in bay three. All first floor windows have keyed lintels and the remains of quoined jambs. The left end stack is rendered and there is a ridge stack opposite the front door.
A History of Scriven	Rose Cottage has a window into the chimney comer but only a single-stack chimney, not a double one. All these houses have central stack chimneys, not one against an outside wall - a plan usually found in the first half of the seventeenth century but much earlier in this part of Yorkshire. It was once an inn called "The Three Horse Shoes".

Rose Cottage is Classified Grade III in the Provisional List of Buildings of Architectural or Historic Interest.
