The Houses of Scriven Green	<p>Next we must consider Ivy Cottage. This house, as it now stands dates from the very end of the 17th or beginning of the 18th century, and has a roof of that period with two principal trusses. The plan is similar to that of Peartree with housestead and parlour in front and dairy and kitchen behind in an outshot, but there are no big inglenook fireplaces, just 'modern' 13th century brick chimney stacks. In the ceiling, however, there are some very fine moulded beams that cannot be later than the 16th century, and which may belong to the house as it was before it took on its present form around 1700. Alternatively, as this was not a farmhouse but a craftsman's cottage, perhaps it housed the Estate Carpenter of the day who re-used beams taken from some finer building he had been working in.</p>

Ivy Cottage	<p>This house dates from the end of the seventeenth or beginning of the eighteenth century and the roof is of that period with two principle trusses. Similar in plan to that of Peartree Cottage with Housestead and parlour at the front with dairy and kitchen behind in an outshot but this building has no large inglenook fireplaces, just eighteenth century brick chimney stacks. In the ceiling there are some very fine moulded beams that cannot be later than sixteenth century and may belong to the house as was before alteration in around 1700. This was probably a craftsman's cottage, perhaps a carpenter who re-used beams from some finer buildings he had worked in.</p>

Having a Southerly aspect, the Cottage is situated at the Western end of the Village, going away from the Village Green. It is stone built, having a pantile roof in the front and flagstone at the rear. The Accommodation is spacious, having :_Half glazed Entrance PORCH. Front SITTING ROOM having modern tiled Fireplace, exposed beams and Power Point. LIVING ROOM. Modern tiled Fireplace and Back Boiler. Built in Cupboards and glazed Display Cupboard. Power Point. KITCHEN. Single drainer Sink Unit. Electric Cooker Point. Built in Cupboards. Large PANTRY with Shelving and Cold Slab. ONE DOUBLE BEDROOM. TWO SINGLE BEDROOMS.
