The Houses of Scriven Green

Earl's Cottage is a genuine Georgian cottage, that is, it was built as a cottage in the late 18th or early 19th century and not adapted from some other use. The plan has a long history behind it, something rather like it having turned up at Peartree in the 17th century. The front door leads into a living room which has the only hearth and the stairs leading out of one corner. The rest of the house is divided into two tiny service rooms, probably a scullery in front and a pantry under the stairs. The front of the cottage, though, is strictly symmetrical, even to the mock window in the middle to balance the facade. This was the home of a labourer's family with no land attached it is a good size smaller than the craftsmen's cottages we have already looked at. Older stone work in the back wall makes it likely that this is a rebuild of an older house, but it is a total reconstruction, not an adaptation.
