This suggests this area was occupied by the prisoners and the clear area were probably assembly points. To the E of this section of the camp are two larger buildings in the N extent of field 23. The E extent of the camp is to the N of Scriven Hall in fields 26 and 66. The layout suggests this area was the administration and medical facilities for the camp.

A to Z of Knaresborough History	SCRIVEN HALL During the Second World War it was requisitioned by the government and used for secret operations, even being visited by Winston Churchill, and later used for prisoners of war.	
Fire at Scriven Hall	Scriven Hall and estate were requisitioned by the War Office early in the war. The estate was occupied by the military and then became a camp for prisoners of war, and later for European voluntary workers.	
Scriven Hall handed back to Owners	The hall and estate were requisitioned in January, 1940, for military occupation. Afterwards a camp was erected for prisoners of war. This was later occupied by European voluntary workers.
